TANK ANNOUNCES NEW TOP LEVEL MANAGEMENT TEAM

(Ft. Wright, KY)—June 14, 2007 – The TANK Board of Directors recently announced the selection of a General Manager and Deputy General Manager for the three-county transit agency.

Effective immediately, **Mary Lou Franzoni** was named General Manager, responsible for day to day internal operations and management of the \$19 million agency. Franzoni will oversee operations, maintenance and administration for the agency.

Andrew Aiello, was named Deputy General Manager, a newly created position, responsible for external relations. Aiello will focus on government relations, communication with external stakeholders and will oversee marketing, planning and communications efforts.

Franzoni, a contracted manager from First Transit (http://www.firsttransit.com/press_FtWright.php), has more than 20 years of experience in the transit industry. Recent experience includes Transportation Director at Chapel Hill (NC) Transit , Assistant General Manager at Alexandria (VA) Transit Company, and Operations Manager at Foothill (CA) Transit.

Aiello has been with TANK since 2004, most recently serving as TANK's Assistant Director of Communications and Development, where he was responsible for the authority's long-range planning, regional planning coordination, and major capital development projects.

Prior to TANK, he served as Senior Planner for Atlanta's metropolitan planning organization, the Atlanta Regional Commission, where he managed a large-scale transit corridor study for Interstate-285, on one of the nation's most congested transportation corridors. Andrew began his career in Atlanta with the Georgia Department of Transportation managing the environmental compliance process for major transportation projects.

Aiello graduated from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio with degrees in Urban Planning and Philosophy (Phi Beta Kappa). He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP).
